The thesis deals with alternative solutions to the current form of health and social care for the elderly. The author points to the problem of over-specialisation of care, which results in the need for frequent changes of environment in clients with deteriorating health. The thesis builds on a pre-diploma project that explored the differences between different types of care and proposes to combine the selected types of care into a coherent whole – a stable home. Such a home offers continuity of care, stability of relationships between clients and staff and an unchanging environment. The stable home is presented in the form of a more generally applicable typology and subsequently tested on a specific design of a home on náměstí Míru in Brno.

The project works with the thesis that the celebration of the Eucharist is not dependent on place, or that under certain conditions any space can become a liturgical space. Conversely, one can consider whether it is possible to adapt the strictly liturgical space of a church to an alternative programme that does not necessarily involve traditional church ceremonies, while preserving its sacred character. Using the case study of the adaptation of the Church of St. Giles in Brno-Líšeň, the author relates to the broader issues of the Czech Roman Catholic Church, which is currently in an important period of transition in terms of demography (decline in the number of believers and clergy), economics (financial separation of the Church from the state) and culture (completion of property restitution). The proposed solution is not a conversion of the church to a different function, but its structural and cultural hybridisation referring to the possibility of a more pluralistic concept of the church.
